

# Printing Quilt Labels (January/February 2024 Q.U.I.L.T.S. Program)

## Why Print?

- Requires less of **my** time (primary reason).
  - Doesn't require all the set up of embroidery
  - Still takes time (mostly for drying) and planning ahead
- Flexibility
  - Preprinted labels are OK but have limited space

## Materials Needed

- Word Processor such as Microsoft Word
- Inkjet printer (cannot use laser printer)
- Room temperature water in shallow tray large enough to lay the label out flat
- **Print-ready** fabric (not just any fabric)
  - EQ Printables, June Taylor, JoAnn's, Avery, PhotoFabric, & Others
    - EQ Printables from Electric Quilt
    - #1 in comparison study published several years ago in Newsletter Magazine

- What I've always used
- 8-1/2"x11"
- 6 sheets per pack
- Warm white color (not snow white)
- 3 qualities of EQ Printables
  - **\*Premium Cotton Satin Inkjet Fabric Sheets** (283 thread count). "Special satin-weave finish produces brilliant printed images of unmatched clarity and sharpness." High thread count gives the best, smoothest print.  
 \*This is the one I use for labels.
  - **Sewable Inkjet Fabric Sheets** (240 thread count). "...the softest, best-quality printable quilt-weight fabric perfect for your finest quilts....great for photo quilts..."
  - **Cotton Basic Inkjet Fabric Sheets** (200 thread count). 1) available in more sizes, 2) "Cotton Basic is the most versatile EQ Printables fabric sheet, perfect for quilt labels, pillows, memory quilts, fabric

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scrapbooks, and more! The warm white fabric makes photo-complexions glow.”

## Process

- Prepare your label (Word Processor)
  - Once it is set up, reuse it again and again
  - First, hit the return key a few times
  - Then, insert (after the first paragraph symbol) a table with as many columns & rows as you want. I start with 1 row & 3 columns
    - Allows for 2 photos with label info in the center
    - Can delete 1 column if I only want to include 1 photo
    - If I want to include a long, horizontal photo at the top,
      - Delete 2 columns and
      - Insert a row
  - Things to know how to do in Word
    - Add a table
    - Turn on the paragraph symbol
    - Turn off lines (make table lines disappear)
    - Alter space between labels. Leave at least 1” between labels
    - Alter text size & style
- Print onto the fabric sheet using an inkjet printer.
- I run a test print on plain paper, first.
  - I can see how the label will look and
  - It helps me to put the EQ Printable Fabric in the printer to print correctly
- Allow ink to dry 15 minutes. Peel off plastic backing
- Soak in room-temperature water for 10 minutes to remove excess printer ink. Rinse until water runs clear.
- Blot between towels and lay flat to dry. I have used a hair dryer to speed up dry time.
- Cut/trim
- Sew a SIMPLE/SINGLE narrow binding on 2-4 sides.
  - Hard to sew through 283 thread count, treated fabric
  - Simple binding can add color design and will be easier to stitch to the back of your quilt
  - IF you will sew 2 sides into the quilt binding, you only need to bind the **other 2** sides of the label.

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- Cut 1" binding
- Machine stitch on front of label with 1/4" allowance
- Press away from label
- Fold over to the back side of label - no need to stitch it to the back
- Whip through the fold of the binding

### TIPS

- What I include on a label
  - Name, including maiden name (the genealogist/historian in me)
  - Location
  - Quilter's name, if someone other than me
  - Pattern name
  - Designer name
  - Story, if I think it important enough
    - Started in a class (who taught, who sponsored the class, etc.)
    - Historical notes, when appropriate
- I print up to 4 labels per sheet, not all at the same time
- Run a test print on plain paper before printing on printable fabric. I mark an X in the lower left corner of the test paper. Then I know how I need to place the printable fabric in the paper tray for printing.
