

Q.U.I.L.T.S. Logo – 12” Foundation Paper Pieced Block (Bonus block for 2024 BOM)

Read all directions before beginning. This pattern assumes knowledge of foundation paper piecing.

Prepare the Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP) Pattern

1. Print FPP pattern on FPP paper or newsprint. Regular copy paper “may” be used, but it is more difficult to remove without pulling stitches. If using copy paper, I suggest that you stitch on all of the lines without thread to better perforate the paper BEFORE adding fabric.
2. The pattern has 4 sections (A, B, C, D), plus 2 strips that are added at the end (not paper pieced).
 - a. Section A – Cut outside the dotted lines. No need to be exact but be sure to leave the full seam allowance, as marked.
 - b. Five sections print on 2 pages. Complete the next steps to join pieces of the same section together.
 - c. Section B (side of house with windows)
 - i. Cut out the piece with B2, B3, B4, B5, B6. No need to be exact. Be sure to leave the dotted line and all solid lines.
 - ii. Cut out the piece with B1. No need to be exact. Be sure to leave the dotted line and all solid lines.
 - iii. Match the dotted lines of B1 on each piece. I find it easier to cut one sheet of paper on the dotted line, then, overlapping that piece with the other. Match up the left side of Section B (B1-B6) to the right side (B1, B6, B7).
 - iv. Tape the B sections together to form the roof section. The top and bottom lines should form straight lines (no jogs). If they aren’t straight, carefully cut through the tape and re-align the left and right sides and tape again. It should look like this:



- d. Section C (roof and sky) –
 - i. Cut out the piece with C1, C2 and part of C3. No need to be exact. Be sure to leave the dotted line and all solid lines.
 - ii. Cut out the piece with C3 and C4. No need to be exact. Be sure to leave the dotted line and all solid lines.
 - iii. Match the dotted lines of C3 on each piece. I find it easier to cut one sheet of paper on the dotted line, then, overlapping that piece with the other. Match up the left side of Section C (C4 & C3) to the right side (C1, C2 & part of C3).
 - iv. Tape the C sections together to form the roof section. The top and bottom lines should form straight lines (no jogs). If they aren’t straight, carefully cut through the tape and re-align the left and right sides and tape again. It should look like this:

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e. Section D (chimneys and sky) - Repeat above steps. It should look like this



Cutting Fabric:

Sky Fabric	C4 and C2: Cut 2	5" x 5-1/2"	Cut in half diagonally

Constructing the Logo Block:

1. Stitch each section, laying the fabric on the paper and stitching in numeric order. Remember, you will be stitching on the printed side, and your fabric pieces will be placed on the non-printed side.
2. When all Sections A, B, C and D are completed, it's time to stitch sections together. This may be done in any order, but I recommend stitching C to D, first. Line Up the chimney pieces with the roof. The D1-D2 seam should match the C4-C3 seam. And the D4-D5 seam should match the point where C3-C1-C2 come together.
3. Press the seam toward Section D.
4. Join Sections A and B. Be sure to join the sections by meeting B1 and A3. Otherwise, your door will be upside down. There are no seams to match.
5. Now, sew the A/B unit to the C/D unit, matching the C3-C1 seam to the B6-A4 seam.
6. Sew the 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" sky strip to the top of Section D, for the sky
7. Sew the 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" grass strip to the bottom of the A/B unit for grass
